Each local commercial station in the UK has obligations with regard to its programmes, including its music and local content. These obligations are set out in the station Format which forms part of this station's Public File.

The Public File is also available in hard copy by post upon request by any member of the public, and serves as one indicator of each station's output. Comment on the contents of the Public File should be made to the station or to the industry regulator, Ofcom.

Radio Carmarthenshire and Scarlet FM operate under a single station license issued by Ofcom. As a licensee, we may provide a separate programming and advertising service for Llanelli.

However, for some years we have shared all programme content including commercials and branding between Radio Carmarthenshire and Scarlet FM.

In January 2017 with permission from Ofcom we removed the brand Scarlet FM from the marketplace.

News Bulletin schedule

What our format says...

At least hourly news Weekday Breakfast and Drivetime and Saturday late breakfast. Outside peak, UK wide, nations and international news should feature.

What we deliver....

Radio Carmarthenshire broadcasts international news every hour with the exception of Sundays at 1600, 1700 and 1800.

Radio Carmarthenshire broadcasts a News for Wales bulletin weekdays from 6am to 6pm inclusive and weekends from 8am to 12 noon inclusive which is a bulletin of International and Wales news compiled for the Nation Broadcasting Group.

In addition to the News for Wales bulletin which will sometimes contain locally relevant stories, Radio Carmarthenshire broadcasts dedicated local news bulletins weekdays from 6am to 6pm inclusive and weekends from 8am to 12 noon inclusive.

The news team is further supplemented by members of management and administrative staff based within the area who are also able to collect content as appropriate including Programme Managers based at St Hilary and Narberth.

There is a regional office based at Parc Y Scarlets, Llanelli which is within the station's licensed area.

Nation Broadcasting has an agreement with Radio News Hub (RNH) to compile and deliver news bulletins into its group stations. RNH has offices located in Leeds.

Outside of peak hours the stations broadcasts the IRN network bulletin from Sky News

The programme schedule

The average number of hours of automated programming within weekday daytimes and within daytimes on Saturdays and Sundays

At Radio Carmarthenshire we make full use of broadcast playout technology in order to deliver our programmes and free up presentation staff to produce local content.

All programming is automated overnight from

Monday - Friday	0000 to 0600 and 1900 to 2400
Saturday	0000 to 0800 and 1800 to 2400
Sunday	0000 to 0900 and 1600 to 2400

At other times programming may be left in automation for brief periods to allow presenters to undertake training and other duties (whilst they remain on site at the broadcast centre). Typically, daytime programming is live or recorded immediately prior to transmission (in the case of split broadcasting)

The amount of local programming per day produced by the station

With the exception of the Hit 40 UK Chart (Sun 1600-1900) and the Great Destination Travel Show (Mon 2100-2200) all programmes on Radio Carmarthenshire are delivered locally from one of Nation Broadcasting's two broadcast centres in the Ofcom West Wales approved area.

The broadcast centres are located within the licensed area of Pembrokeshire and Radio Carmarthenshire is permitted to locate in either of these areas (and some others).

Some programming items such as news and travel may be compiled by presenters physically located outside of the broadcast centre.

Shared programming and content

Radio Carmarthenshire is permitted to share all programming and content with 4 other local radio stations operated by Nation Broadcasting provided it meets and fulfils its character of service obligations within the format.

Typically programming is shared as follows:-

Radio Carmarthenshire with Radio Ceredigion – 24 hours a day / 7 days a week

Radio Carmarthenshire with Bridge FM / Swansea Bay - Monday to Thursday 6am-9pm, Friday 6am-7pm, Saturday 8am to 6pm, Sunday 6am to 8am and 9am to 7pm

Radio Carmarthenshire with Radio Pembrokeshire – Monday to Thursday 6am-9pm, Friday 6am-7pm, Saturday 8am to 6pm, Sunday 6am to 7pm, 9pm to 10pm.

Within shared programming a significant amount of programming is 'split' for example local news, regional rugby bulletins, local events, and some presentation links, giving a different listener experience for each station.

The Rugby Nation show (Wednesday 7pm-8pm) and Football Nation show (Thursday 7pm-8pm) is shared across the Nation Radio group including Nation Radio.

As stated above, although the programming is shared under Ofcom's definition; there is a considerable amount of market specific programming broadcast during shared programming. This includes:-

- Local news specific to the county
- Local events specific to the county
- Various programming links and interviews which are station specific
- Branding and advertising specific to the county

We also retain the ability for stations to stand alone should there be an editorial reason to do so (for example a station specific event broadcast – such as a highlights show following a station awards event, for example).

Welsh language is spoken at other times by fluent speakers involved in programme production / presentation particularly at Breakfast.
